At the recent **Mennonite Church USA** assembly, delegates approved an updated statement on Immigration: **Church Statement Resolution on Immigration** / **Declaración de toda la Iglesia sobre la inmigración** which also lists resources for education and ministry related to immigration justice.

MENNONITE CENTRAL COMMITTEE ANNOUNCEMENTS

Since January 20, 2025, the U.S. government has made drastic immigration policy changes that are affecting newly arrived immigrants (through various pathways) and have also put at risk the lives of immigrants currently living in the U.S. MCC's partner organizations in the U.S. are asking MCC to respond to help provide support for community members and churches through a virtual Know Your Rights Training to be held on August 14 and 15, at 6-8 pm each day.
