## THIS WEEK @ FMC - October 1-7, 2025

Sometimes we feel like asking God: are you paying attention? And God asks us too: are we paying attention?

These honest words were part of our call to worship this past Sunday, part of a deeper dive into the story of Moses and the burning bush in Exodus 3. We live within the mystery of exactly how it is God 'pays attention' to human life, when and why God chooses to create a clear moment of intersection – like the burning bush for Moses. God is beyond our understanding, and so we can't begin to figure it all out, but what we know is we are always invited to be paying attention so we can tune into the melody of God sounding within our ordinary days. Or, perhaps God's presence is more like how David G. Benner suggests in his book, Opening to God:

"Although we are often tempted to think that God is absent, in truth, it is we who are absent. If God were absent, we would not be. Our being is dependent on God's being.

God's presence is grounded not simply in the promises of Scripture but in creation. Creation was not simply an event at a discrete moment in time. When God called the world into being, God established a reality that was absolutely dependent on continuous, sustaining divine presence.

This is why Thomas Aquinas argued that we should never think of creation as an event with a before and after. Creation is ongoing. It is now. It is the unremitting outpouring of the life of God-an outpouring that is essential to sustain all that is.

Rowan Williams, the archbishop of Canterbury, offers an analogy that I find helpful in understanding the implications of this. This about a light bulb. We know that when we turn on the switch and the light begins to shine, this is made possible because of electric current. However, that does not mean that the power was around only at the moment we turned on the switch. On the contrary, he argues, 'the light is shining here and now because the electric current is flowing here and now. In the same way, it is the 'current' of divine activity that is here and now making us real.'"
